## Wealth . . . How Would You Define It?

Often when we measure wealth, the first thing that comes to mind is monetary wealth—dollars and cents. But wealth can mean a lot of different things besides financial wealth. Wealth is owned by someone and is assigned to them by virtue of something they have done or what someone else has done to or for them. Sometimes a gift is bestowed on someone, but more often wealth is earned over time—time spent doing the right thing in the right way.

When you think of a wealthy church, what do you envision? A big, modern building with a huge parking lot? Perhaps you think of a huge budget and grandiose building projects. Do wealthy churches make great churches? Do you like attending the “wealthy” churches?

As far as God is concerned, does HE view wealth by the same standards we do? Did Christ praise the Pharisees and their Synagogues? They had rules to follow, and they made a show of trying to follow them. Where did Christ carry out his ministry? Was it in big opulent buildings? Was it with the pious leaders of that day? Did Christ heap praise on the Pharisees? The Pharisees disdained those who were not a part of their sect—they became exclusive instead of inclusive. Unlike the Pharisees, Christ went out to people and engaged them as they were, where they were, and spoke to them about needful things in their lives.

When we look at wealth, we may ask, “Do material things produce wealth, or is real wealth intangible?” When I ask myself, in what ways am I rich? I think it is a “gift” that my grown children love each other and enjoy being together—a gift that will live after I’m gone. Cold cash can’t buy this. I think of my marriage and all we have been through together—that is a gift. I think of friends, some go back fifty years, others linger in my memory. It was a gift to have known them. Taken together, all these gifts make up the “wealth” of my life’s estate. The “currency” this wealth is traded in is time—time spent with these key people in my life. There would be no accumulation of this *golden wealth* without the investment of time in these relationships.

So it is with Christ’s church: We must spend the time to develop relationships—relationships with the unsaved, relationships with those who are overwhelmed by life’s events, relationships with those who are grieving, relationships with those in “quiet desperation,” relationships with those who have their whole lives before them and still feel that they are invincible, relationships with those in troubled marriages, relationships with our singles (of all ages), relationships that are living examples of God’s love to mankind.

A church’s wealth is measured by its relationships, their scope and their depth. El Camino’s wealth will be measured by its relationships with its unsaved neighbors and their changed lives through Christ. We must follow Christ’s model: meet people where they are, as they are, accepting them the way they are, but ever demonstrating Christ’s life-changing love for them.

***Then El Camino will be a wealthy church.***

## **"I Love To Tell The Story"**

A response to "Why We Send Our Kids to Camp" 6/9/2019 by Becky Fuchser

"I Love to tell the Story of Jesus and His love! ...and especially to children!" Pastor Ford's message, "Why We Send Our Kids to Camp!" challenged: "As a Christian, it is your responsibility to pass down the story of Jesus to the next generation. It changed your life. Lift up the next generation—tell them the story of Jesus. Tell them your story." And that is when fireworks exploded and sparks ignited my soul with excitement! What a great honor and privilege God gives us—to tell the story of Jesus to the next generation!

El Camino has been telling the story of Jesus to children for years—through Sunday School, Awana, Good News Clubs, camps, and many other outreaches to children and families!

Certainly, we tell the story to our children and grandchildren—for our family that is ten people. But, out there are multitudes of children who do not know the story of Jesus because no one has told them. Their parents have not told them because no one told them—and how many generations back does that go?

A super method for telling the story of Jesus to the next generation is in a Good News Club! I love to tell the children about Jesus in Good News Club! My favorite part is telling the Bible story while weaving the Gospel throughout the lesson. Gospel truths are combined with Scripture as the Bible story is told. The really cool part is that the Holy Spirit works, applying the Truths and Scripture to the child's heart! And children respond and trust in Jesus as Savior! WOW! The next generation learns and accepts the story of Jesus! It changes their lives! Jesus lovingly commands us, "Let the little children come unto Me; and do not hinder them for of such is the kingdom of heaven." What a precious honor and privilege to tell the story of Jesus to children! This is why the Holy Spirit filled my heart and soul with excitement at Pastor Ford's message! I cannot NOT do this!

Pastor Ford also noted, "If the story of Jesus is not passed down from one generation to the next, it will be forgotten and what happened in Israel will happen (and is happening) to our next generation."

"And there arose another generation after them who did not know the LORD or the work that He had done for Israel." Judges 2:19.

Why didn't they obey God and tell the next generation? It's hard to understand because many had witnessed some of these works—even as children. But they didn't tell! Grave discipline and distress overtook the Israelites. They became slaves to all kinds of evil because they forgot God.

Why do we send our kids to camp and tell them the story of Jesus? So that His Story will be remembered, believed, accepted, and change lives. And retold! Christians have a great opportunity to tell the story of Jesus to the next generation right in the public schools of America. In 2001, the Supreme Court ruled that Good News Clubs be allowed access (after school) to teach clubs on public school campuses under the same conditions and with the same rights as other civic organizations that use school facilities such as Boy Scouts. Since that time, 10,000s of children—the next generation—have heard and believed and live the story of Jesus. What a sense of humor God has—He was kicked out of public schools but He essentially said, "No way, the children WILL hear the story of Jesus!" Guess He hasn't heard of separation of church and state! So, He is back in and to make it firm it is with legal approval! And the story goes on! Sometimes the next generation reaches the previous generation. One little boy kept responding to the invitation to be counseled for salvation. "I want to hear the story again," he would say. He loved Jesus and he retold the story! As a result, his family accepted Jesus as Savior! The next generation and beyond is waiting for someone to tell them the story of Jesus.





***The Lady of Tarpon Springs*** by Judith Miller


Zanna Krykos challenges her family's expectations when she passes the bar exam and becomes a lawyer in the town of Tarpon Springs, Florida in the early 1900s. When her friend Lucy loses her father and finds herself inheriting a barely-established sponge business, Zanna volunteers her services to manage the business for her friend. Soon a crew of men arrive from successful sponging industries in Greece, ready to begin the area's first sponging expedition. As one of the few Greek families in the area, the Krykos family helps these men and their manager, Nico Kalos, adjust to life in Florida. Facing unanticipated challenges to the fledgling business, Nico and Zanna work together to manage the crews and make Lucy's sponge business a great success.



While the characters are all fictional, the story gives an interesting and accurate view of the time and place, including the arrival of Greek sponge divers, an industry that continues to play an important role in the small town as it also sustains tourism in the area. Miller says, "If you find yourself in Florida, do stop in Tarpon Springs. Take a walking tour of the city, visit the history museum and the docks. Partake of the Greek cuisine and pastries and visit the sponge shops located in the old Sponge Exchange."

***Evie Blackwell Cold Case Series*** by Dee Henderson


***Traces of Guilt***




